During last month's Great Backyard Bird Count weekend, I left the monitoring of our backyard feeders to my wife Ann for a while, and headed to South Creek, to see what birds might be there.


South Creek is an urban stream in Springfield, running west from near Battlefield Mall to its junction with Wilson's Creek. The closest stretch is about a mile from my house.

A significant portion of South Creek runs down a concrete gutter, banked on either side by green lawn that gets mowed every couple of weeks during the warm months. As you might imagine, it's not a great place for birds, other than a few indiscriminating mallards and an occasional killdeer or migrating snipe.

But upstream of Campbell Avenue, it meanders in a natural channel all the way from National. Willows and buttonbush and patches of cattails shade it, and a couple of small woodlots adjoin it. The South Creek Greenway winds alongside.

And here, too, intersect the three elements of the Greater Ozarks Audubon Society's conservation mission: habitat management, education, and advocacy.

The habitat management might be the most obvious, at least to the trained eye. Invasive weeds are rarer in this stretch, and native prairie wildflowers grow along the banks and in a small garden along the trail. GOAS members are responsible for much of this work. The education has occurred at special events held along the creek, including some involving students from nearby Holland Elementary, which is within walking distance. GOAS members



have organized these.

The advocacy is perhaps the least evident, but arguably the most important. There was a time when the City of Springfield considered putting this stretch of South Creek into a concrete gutter, too. GOAS, led by the tireless Kay Johnson, worked with the Public Works Department to keep this stream natural. So it remains, and the City is now a proponent of a greener variety of stormwater management, one that has room for birds and other wildlife.

As a result, I found a mockingbird there, along with other "country" birds. Last spring, a ruby-throated hummingbird built a nest overhanging the trail, and migrating warblers sang in the adjoining woods.

Because we have been so involved with this section of stream over the years, GOAS has a sense of ownership. We hope you will share it with us. One great opportunity comes this month. On Saturday the 23rd, from 9am until noon, Myra Scroggs will lead a Volunteer Work Day on South Creek. Plan to meet us in the parking lot of McDaniel Park at South National and Sunset. Bring work gloves, water, and a snack.

And you might want to tuck a pair of binoculars into your backpack, too—to enjoy the birds attracted by the work of all the folks who have come before you.
